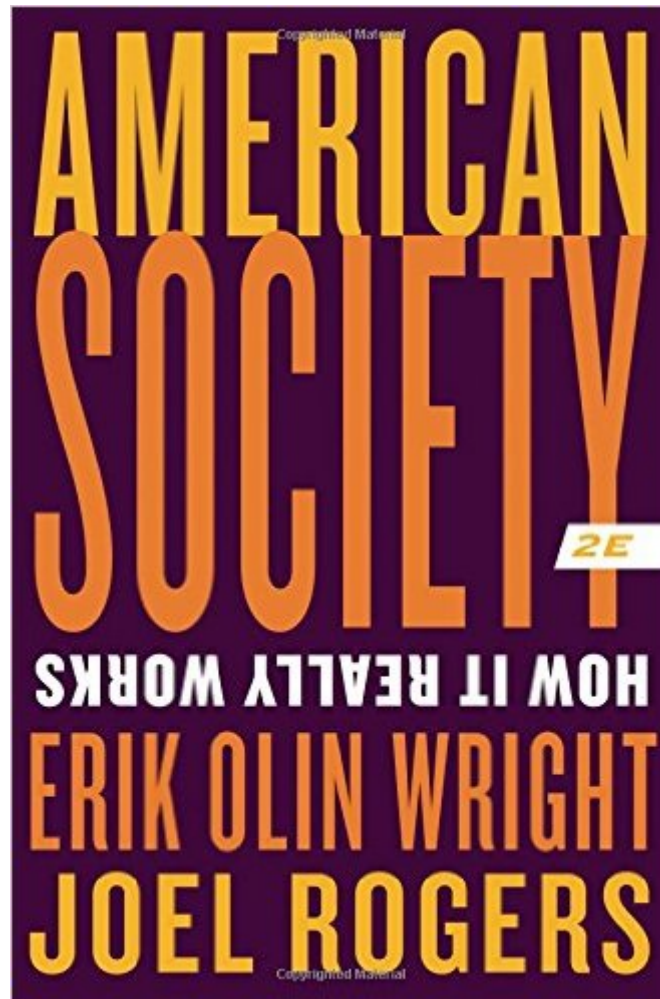

Synopsis
